

FERC Certificate Does NOT mean PennEast Approval!!

Although FERC has issued a conditional Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to PennEast on January 19, this does NOT mean the project is approved or that construction can begin. PennEast does NOT have authority to survey or otherwise enter your land until AFTER eminent domain hearings, and you do not have to permit them on your property until they have received Orders for Possession from the Federal Court. In fact, our continued refusal to allow surveying makes it that much harder for PennEast to comply with NJ DEP and other agency requirements, who will determine if PennEast actually gets the permits to build.

PennEast has been ramping up its efforts to get landowners to sign easement agreements now. But legal experts confirm that going through eminent domain gives landowners the right to fight for higher compensation, restricts approval to only one pipeline, and allows for petition to the Court to overturn the eminent domain award if and when this project is denied or withdrawn. You do not have those rights if you voluntarily sign an easement now.
